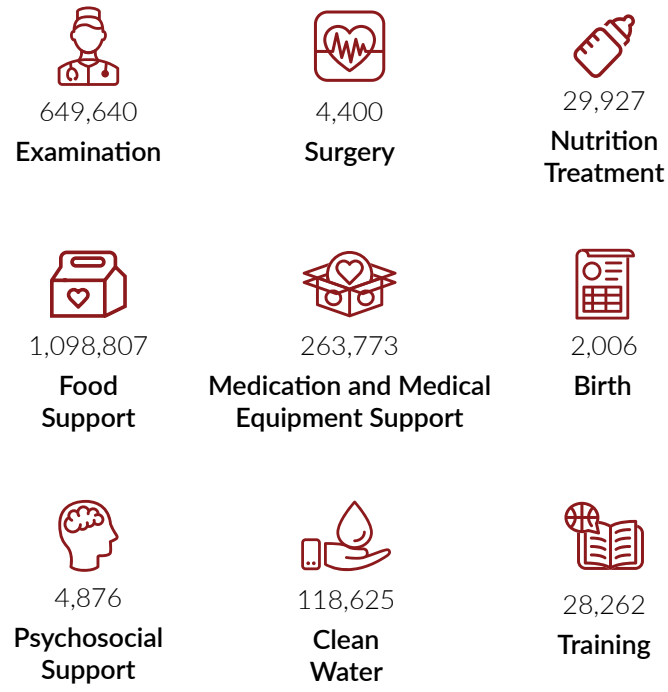

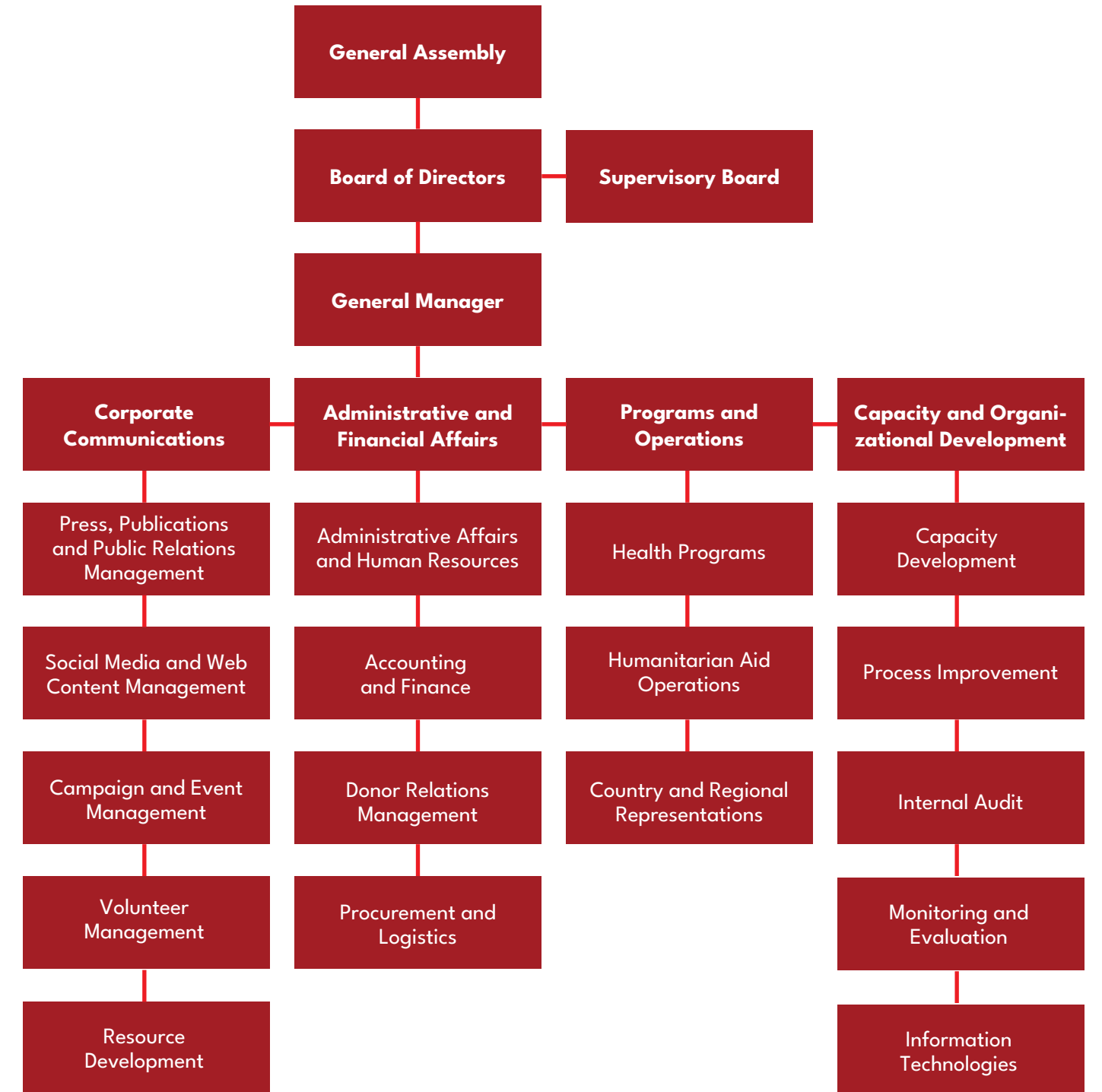

2.2. MAIN AREAS OF ACTIVITY

2.2.1. Emergency Projects

Yeryüzü Doktorları provides emergency treatment services by sending volunteer medical teams to the relevant region in the first place in the event of war and crisis situations as well as natural disasters such as earthquakes, floods, and fires, and supplies medication and equipment. In line with identified needs, it supports the repair and operation of damaged hospitals or health centers, establishes field hospitals and health centers, and forms mobile healthcare teams. It also develops and implements medium- to long-term projects to restore basic needs related to healthcare infrastructure affected by crisis situations.



2.2.2. Maternal and Child Health Projects

Yeryüzü Doktorları opens maternal and child health centers or improves the existing centers in those regions where mother and child death are observed frequently. These centers provide health care services such as routine check-ups for pregnant and nursing mothers, safe deliveries, vaccination of infants, and pediatric examinations. Additionally, training on infant care and reproductive health is provided to pregnant, postpartum, or nursing mothers.



2.2.3. Nutrition Health Projects

Within the scope of nutrition health projects, Yeryüzü Doktorları establishes and supports nutrition health centers in regions where hunger problems are frequently experienced due to drought, poverty, internal conflicts, and similar causes. At these centers, malnutrition caused by inadequate nutrition — particularly in children under five and pregnant/nursing mother — is treated. In cases where medical nutrition treatment cannot be provided, food support in the form of food packages and qurbani meat distribution is delivered.



2.2.4. Eye Health Projects

Yeryüzü Doktorları treats eye diseases, primarily cataracts, and distributes eyeglasses through its eye health projects in regions in need. The organization also contributes to strengthening local health systems by providing equipment support and medical training.



2.2.5. Volunteer Medical Team Projects

Yeryüzü Doktorları provides health care services in both surgical and internal medicine branches in regions in need. To this end, it organizes short-term camps in locations where physical facilities are available but specialist doctors are lacking and where medication and consumable costs generally cannot be covered. At these camps, cases requiring advanced specialization are examined and operated on by Yeryüzü Doktorları Volunteer Medical Teams. Knowledge and experience sharing with local health workers during these operations is an integral part of the entire process.



2.2.6. Medical Training Projects

Yeryüzü Doktorları supports associate degree, bachelor's, and graduate level education, certificate, and specialization programs to increase health worker capacity in countries where it operates projects and programs, aiming to ensure sustainable benefit. It contributes to scientific research and activities by organizing congresses.



2.2.7. Psychosocial Support Projects

Yeryüzü Doktorları conducts screenings and assessments aimed at providing psychosocial support to individuals affected by trauma, disasters, and crisis situations, and carries out activities to inform and support the local population. By assessing the current state of local mental health systems, it develops psychosocial support projects in line with community needs. It also provides psychosocial assistance to civil society workers and Volunteer Medical Teams working in the field.



2.2.8. WASH Projects

Yeryüzü Doktorları drills water wells and improves clean water access infrastructure in regions experiencing drought and where infrastructure is inadequate, in order to prevent diseases caused by the use of contaminated water. It also intervenes in the situations requiring emergency solutions through the distribution of water purification tablets.



2.3. NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIONS

Yeryüzü Doktorları carries out its activities in coordination and partnership with international organizations such as the World Health Organization (WHO), United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), World Food Programme (WFP), United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), International Medical Cooperation (IMC), United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), German Agency for International Cooperation (GIZ), and the International Organization for Migration (IOM), as well as national organizations such as the Republic of Türkiye Ministry of Health, the Republic of Türkiye Ministry of Interior, the Republic of Türkiye Ministry of Family and Social Services, Turkish Cooperation and Coordination Agency (TİKA), Disaster and Emergency Management Authority (AFAD), and the Turkish Red Crescent. In the countries where it operates, the organization also establishes project-based partnerships with local health authorities, national/international civil society organizations, and universities.

3.1. EMERGENCY PROJECTS

3.1.1. Afrin Jindires Refugee Health Center

Yeryüzü Doktorları established the Jindires Refugee Health Center in October 2018 in the Afrin/Jindires region of Syria to provide primary health care services to refugees living in the Muhammediye and Deyr Ballut camps. The center offers health care services in the branches of internal medicine, gynecology, pediatrics, dental health, and emergency observation. Free medication support is also provided, and psychosocial support activities have been conducted for children. As of October 2025, the health center completed its operations due to the decrease in demand in the region.

3.1.2. Suluk Health Center

Yeryüzü Doktorları has been providing primary health care services in the Tel Abyad/Suluk region of Syria since December 2020. The center provides services in the branches of internal medicine, pediatrics, gynecology, dental health, dermatology, emergency observation, and ear, nose, and throat. In addition to these services, patients are also provided with free medication support.

3.1.3. Palestine Program

Having carried out various health-related activities in Gaza — home to approximately 2 million Palestinians — since the 2000s, Yeryüzü Doktorları identified through needs assessments that the region's greatest health issue was the need for physical therapy and rehabilitation services, and has focused its efforts in this area since 2014. Under the Yeryüzü Doktorları Gaza Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation program, the organization provided equipment and operational support to two physical therapy and rehabilitation centers operating with limited resources in the northern Gaza area and Gaza City in 2014, and established a new physical therapy and rehabilitation center in the Khan Yunis area in southern Gaza in 2015. In 2016, mobile health services were added and home treatment, medical care, and psychological support services began with 5 different teams consisting of 22 personnel. Operating in various cities across the Gaza Strip, the teams provided physical therapy and rehabilitation, medical wound care, psychosocial support services, and medicine and medical supply support to more than 65,000 people through the Khan Yunis Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation Center by 2023.

The 7th of October Crisis and Emergency Aid Activities

With the humanitarian crisis that began on October 7, 2023, despite all the impossibilities and risks in the region, humanitarian aid operations for the people of Gaza continued uninterrupted in 2025, as they have for years. Treatment of patients and the wounded continued at the region's largest hospitals, including Shifa, Indonesian, Al-Ahli, and Kuwait Hospitals, as well as Naseer and Al-Aqsa Hospitals. In the northern area, after hospitals were evacuated, health care services were maintained through mobile teams. Following the destruction of health centers, a health center was established at the Alyarmouk refugee camp in the north to provide primary health care services. This health center became the only accessible health point in the area. Vaccination programs were carried out in cooperation with UNICEF at the center to prevent the spread of epidemic diseases, and support was provided for children and pregnant women in their fight against malnutrition. Mobile health teams and emergency aid operations at Shifa Hospital continue actively in the field. At the same time, humanitarian aid materials were delivered to the region through aid trucks prepared at border crossings and through goodwill ships sent from Mersin Port under AFAD coordination. Various efforts were carried out to meet priority and essential needs such as nutrition, clean water access, and hygiene. Gaza Khan Yunis Health Center

The Khan Yunis Physical Therapy Center, which was destroyed following the attacks that began on October 7, was reopened in November 2025 when suitable conditions were established. Physical therapy and rehabilitation services along with primary health care services began to be actively provided within the center; access to health care services for the population in need in the region was restored. The reopening of the Khan Yunis Health Center was assessed as an important step toward recovery for ensuring the continuity of health care services for communities affected by the crisis.





3.1.4. Chad Sido Refugee Health Center

Due to the Central African crisis that began toward the end of 2013, 100,000 refugees who migrated to Chad were resettled in camps established in the country's southeast. Within the scope of the crisis, Yeryüzü Doktorları initially supported a health center in Bangui, the capital of the Central African Republic, and began providing health care services at the Chad Doyaba Refugee Camp in July 2014.

In 2016, a new health center was opened at the Sido Refugee Camp, which hosts 50,000 refugees in Chad's Maro region. Within the center, primary health care services, medication support, and basic laboratory tests are provided free of charge and on a regular basis. Additionally, health care services are delivered to those with limited access to the center through mobile health teams.

3.1.5. Somalia Mogadishu Family Health Center

The Mogadishu Family Health Center, located on the Afgoye road where internally displaced persons (IDPs) reside in Somalia's capital Mogadishu, began providing services in February 2019. Within the center, primary health care services, medication support, and basic laboratory tests are provided free of charge and on a regular basis. Additionally, vaccination services have been offered since November 2025.

3.1.6. Bangladesh Thaingkhali Refugee Health Center

Veryüzü Doktorları has been continuously operating in Bangladesh since 2017. Regular hygiene kit and food parcels support is provided in the region; iftar programs, Qurbani Operations, and cataract camps are also organized.

In 2020, the Thaingkhali Refugee Health Center was opened to provide permanent and continuous health care services to Rohingya refugees living in the Cox's Bazar area. The center provides primary health care services, including examination, treatment, and medication support for those in need.

3.1.7. Emergency Operations

Veryüzü Doktorları carries out efforts aimed at meeting essential needs through food and hygiene kit support during natural disasters and crises such as wars. In line with the needs in the field, it provides emergency health care services through Volunteer Medical Teams and supplies medicine and medical equipment. It establishes field hospitals and mobile health teams, and develops medium- to long-term projects aimed at restoring health infrastructure affected by crises.

3.2. MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH PROJECTS

3.2.1. Soran Maternal and Child Health Center

The Soran Maternal and Child Health Center began operations in June 2018 in the town of Soran in Azez, where the population has neared 300,000 due to internal displacement waves, to provide delivery and primary health care services. Within the center, free examination, laboratory services, and medication support are provided in the branches of gynecology, pediatrics, and internal medicine, along with pregnancy follow-up services.

3.2.2. Yemen Maternal and Child Health Center

Yeryüzü Doktorları began providing maternal and child health care services at 3 different health centers in Yemen's Taiz province in February 2021. However, since August 2022, services have continued only at the Al-Wafa Health Center in Taiz province. The health center provides examination and treatment services in the fields of pediatrics and gynecology, Pregnancy follow-up, delivery services for expectant mothers, and medication support.

3.2.3. Chad Sido Maternal and Child Health Center

Due to the frequent occurrence of maternal and newborn deaths in the region, delivery services were added to the Chad Sido Refugee Health Center, which has been providing uninterrupted services since 2016, as of May 2021. Under this service, gynecology, pregnancy follow-up and birth vaccination services for mothers and newborns, and ultrasound examination services are provided.

3.3. NUTRITION HEALTH PROJECTS

3.3.1. Yemen Taiz Nutrition Health Centers

The civil war that began in Yemen in 2015 and ongoing humanitarian crises have significantly increased nutritional disorders and related diseases, particularly among women and children. In this context, a health center was opened in Yemen's Taiz region in 2021 to provide permanent and continuous services. Operating in the fields of nutrition and maternal health, the center provides medical nutrition treatments particularly for pregnant/nursing mother and children under 5, while also offering gynecological and pediatric examination services. Pregnancy follow-up, ultrasound, delivery, vaccination, and medication support are also provided.

3.3.3. Afghanistan Nutrition Health Centers

Since January 2020, Yeryüzü Doktorları has been providing services with 18 nutrition health centers and 11 mobile health teams across 15 provinces in Afghanistan. These centers provide examination and nutrition treatment services for those in need, primarily pregnant/nursing mother and children.

3.3.4. Somalia Mogadishu Nutrition Health Center

In addition to existing services at the health center opened in Mogadishu in 2019, advanced malnutrition treatment services began to be offered in October of the same year. These centers provide therapeutic food support for children under five, with nutrition treatment lasting 4-8 weeks.

3.3.5. Food Aid

During the 2025 Ramadan period, a total of 8,700 food parcels were distributed and fitre (zakat al-fitr) aid was provided to 700 families across a total of 48 countries including Afghanistan, Angola, Argentina, Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, Benin, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, Chad, El Salvador, Indonesia, Eswatini, Ethiopia, Philippines, Gambia, Guyana, South Africa, Haiti, India, Cambodia, Cameroon, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Kyrgyzstan, Comoros, Kosovo, North Macedonia, Lesotho, Lebanon, Malaysia, Mali, Mexico, Mongolia, Myanmar (Burma), Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Senegal, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Syria, Tanzania, Uganda, Jordan, Yemen, Zambia, and Zimbabwe, reaching a total of 52,400 people. Additionally, iftar programs were organized for 49,700 people in 11 countries – Palestine, Syria, Türkiye, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Yemen, Kenya, Ethiopia, Togo, and Madagascar – throughout the month of Ramadan.

A total of 102,100 people were supported through food aid and iftar programs during the 2025 Ramadan period.



3.3.6. Qurbani Activities

Under the 2025 wajib qurbani operations, 42,793 shares were slaughtered in 19 countries, reaching 864,395 people.

Under the 2025 nafilah qurbani operations, 5,334 shares were slaughtered in 10 countries, reaching 129,529 people.

3.4. EYE HEALTH PROJECTS

Since 2006, Yeryüzü Doktorları has carried out eye health projects in a total of 27 different countries including Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Burkina Faso, Chechnya, Ethiopia, Gambia, Cambodia, Cameroon, Kenya, Congo, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Lebanon, Mali, Mauritania, Nepal, Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Syria, Tanzania, Uganda, and Yemen.

In 2025, a total of 23,453 people received eye examinations, 3,942 underwent cataract surgery, and 5,495 received eye-glass support across 11 countries including Cameroon, Somalia, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Bangladesh, Ethiopia, Tanzania, Nigeria, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Sudan, and Cambodia.

3.5. VOLUNTEER MEDICAL TEAM PROJECTS

Since its founding, Yeryüzü Doktorları has sent more than 250 Volunteer Medical Teams to over 83 countries in both internal medicine and surgical branches in response to requests from around the world. In 2025, the organization organized surgical and internal medicine health camps with 18 Volunteer Medical Teams; throughout the operations, in addition to examinations and surgeries, volunteer doctors provided experience transfer to local health workers.

4.2. RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

Yeryüzü Doktorları signed more than 14 corporate and individual partnerships in 2025 to ensure the sustainability of its activities and reach wider audiences.

Under these partnerships, the Kongwa Health Center was opened in Tanzania to provide health care access for those in need; a mosque was built within the clinic to contribute to the social and spiritual needs of the region. Additionally, ambulance support was provided to health centers offering permanent and continuous services in Chad and Palestine.

Furthermore, nutrition health programs were conducted in Yemen, cataract surgeries were performed across Africa, salary support was provided for doctors serving in Gaza, and projects aimed at increasing access to clean water were also implemented.

In Türkiye, within the scope of sponsorship support for Young Yeryüzü Doktorları university community activities, camps, health street events, and nursing home projects were carried out.



4.3. PRESS, MEDIA AND PUBLIC RELATIONS

January 24, 2025 | "From Humanitarian Crisis to Recovery: Syria" Campaign Brings Hope

Following the end of the Assad regime, major cities in Syria such as Damascus, Aleppo, and Homs faced widespread destruction. Millions of people were displaced, and access to basic needs became nearly impossible. The destruction of hospitals, shortages of health workers, and a crisis in pharmaceutical supply brought health care services in the country to a near standstill. Yeryüzü Doktorları has been supporting the people of Syria – who have been experiencing great difficulties in accessing health care services since the beginning of the crisis in 2011. Having touched the lives of hundreds of thousands through clinics it has opened, mobile health teams, and psychosocial support programs, the association launched its "From Humanitarian Crisis to Recovery: Syria" campaign, calling for support for a healthy society and rewriting the stories left unfinished.

February 6, 2025 | We Have Not Forgotten: Yeryüzü Doktorları in Hatay

Exactly two years have passed since the earthquake described as the "Disaster of the Century." The 7.7 and 7.6 magnitude earthquakes centered in Kahramanmaraş affected 11 provinces, and 53,537 people lost their lives. Yeryüzü Doktorları, Türkiye's volunteer health workers, provided primary health care services and psychosocial support in Kahramanmaraş, Hatay, Adıyaman, and Malatya for 1.5 years, reaching more than 340,000 earthquake survivors. On the second anniversary of the earthquake, Yeryüzü Doktorları visited earthquake survivors living in container cities in Hatay and provided food aid to alleviate the effects of the disaster and to meet essential needs before Ramadan.

March 3, 2025 | "The Difference Between Life and Death" Campaign

According to data from the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) and the World Food Programme (WFP), 733 million people worldwide are battling hunger, while 343 million people in 74 countries live under acute food insecurity. Yeryüzü Doktorları has been running nutrition health projects for years to combat hunger problems caused by drought, poverty, internal conflicts, and similar factors in countries in need. Under these projects, the organization establishes nutrition health centers and provides medical nutrition treatment for malnutrition caused by hunger, drawing attention this year with its "The Difference Between Life and Death" campaign.

March 20, 2025 | Yeryüzü Doktorları Calls for Support Against Hunger

Millions of people around the world suffer from hunger due to wars, conflicts, drought, and poverty. Yeryüzü Doktorları, which has been providing health care services in regions where severe hunger and hunger-related diseases prevail for years, draws attention to the hunger crisis through its annual nutrition health campaign during Ramadan, calling for support for its "The Difference Between Life and Death" campaign.

April 8, 2025 | From Türkiye to Gaza, from Bosnia to Yemen: Food Aid in 52 Countries During Ramadan

Yeryüzü Doktorları, which has been operating for many years in regions where millions of people struggle with hunger, poverty, and war, delivered food aid to 52 countries including Gaza during this year's Ramadan. Having supported more than 900,000 people since the beginning of the October 7 crisis, the organization provided iftar support to more than 40,000 people during Ramadan. On the eve of the holiday, the association's soup kitchen was targeted in an attack. Despite the destruction, the organization continues its work in both food and health care.

April 22, 2025 | Changing of the Guard at Yeryüzü Doktorları

A regular general assembly was held at Yeryüzü Doktorları, and the new leadership was determined. Uzm. Dr. Yahyahan Güney, who had served as chairman of the board of directors for 10 years, completed his term and passed on the baton. Board of Directors member Prof. Dr. Ahmet Salduz was unanimously elected as the new chairman of the board of directors. Dr. Yahyahan Güney will continue his work at the association as Chairman of the Supervisory Board.

April 23, 2025 | April 23 Joy Across the Globe

Yeryüzü Doktorları celebrated April 23 National Sovereignty and Children's Day with children in various parts of the world. Hundreds of children enjoyed events organized at the association's clinics in 7 countries. Furthermore, 31 Young Yeryüzü Doktorları communities from universities in 20 cities came together with children in common areas of hospitals, playing games and organizing coloring activities to boost their morale. This year, for the first time after the end of the regime, an April 23 celebration was held at a primary school in Aleppo.

May 5, 2025 | "Qurbani for Health" from Yeryüzü Doktorları

Having carried out Qurbani Operations for 21 years in regions fighting hunger, Yeryüzü Doktorları will deliver qurbani meat to those in need both domestically and abroad through its "Qurbani for Health" campaign this year. The association will carry out slaughtering and distribution in 21 countries, including a special program for Gaza.

May 30, 2025 | Sharing the Joy of Qurbani with the World

Yeryüzü Doktorları continues its fight against hunger through its annual Qurbani Operations within the framework of its preventive health projects. This year, the association looks forward to donor support through its "Qurbani for Health" campaign to share the joy and blessings of Eid al-Adha in regions in need. Having delivered more than 300,000 qurbani shares to those in need since 2005, the organization will carry out qurbani operations in 19 different countries.

August 19, 2025 | The World Is Watching, Gaza Needs Aid

On August 19, World Humanitarian Day declared by the United Nations, humanitarian aid activities in Gaza continue to face severe obstacles. In Gaza, where convoys are targeted and health and humanitarian workers are losing their lives, humanity is failing. Yeryüzü Doktorları continues its health care and humanitarian aid activities in the region despite the difficult conditions, calling on the international community to support the people of Gaza.

August 28, 2025 | Yeryüzü Doktorları Fights for Babies Amidst Famine

Yeryüzü Doktorları continues its support for the people of Gaza, where the United Nations officially declared famine. The organization delivered baby formula to babies fighting hunger at Al-Rantisi Hospital and provided food aid in northern Gaza, offering vital support to over a thousand people.

September 16, 2025 | A Meaningful Call from Young Yeryüzü Doktorları

Young Yeryüzü Doktorları communities, primarily composed of medical students, drew attention to forest fires nationwide with their "We're Not Cleaning the Trash, We're Cleaning the Fire" event. Young volunteers in Istanbul, Ankara, and Isparta collected plastic and glass waste in forests, inviting everyone to take action to protect nature.

September 24, 2025 | Yeryüzü Doktorları Delivers Qurbani Meat to Gaza Despite All Odds

As famine and hunger in Gaza continue to threaten hundreds of thousands of lives, Yeryüzü Doktorları managed to deliver canned qurbani meat to Gaza, delivering more than 66,000 canned meats to the region where basic food is unavailable, reaching 155,000 people.

October 6, 2025 | "See the Good" Campaign for Millions of Cataract Patients

In regions where millions of people risk losing their vision due to cataracts, Yeryüzü Doktorları draws attention to cataract disease this year as well with its "See the Good" campaign. Having fought to prevent treatable eye diseases for 19 years, the organization continues its activities in regions in need this year to help thousands regain their health.

October 10, 2025 | Young Yeryüzü Doktorları Setting an Example

The Young Yeryüzü Doktorları communities, with more than 20,000 young volunteers — predominantly medical students — continue to produce projects for the benefit of society. During the 2024–2025 academic year, Young Yeryüzü Doktorları carried out over 600 events across universities, earning public appreciation through their health, social responsibility, and humanitarian aid-focused activities.

October 24, 2025 | Yeryüzü Doktorları Seeks Support for Cataract Patients

Yeryüzü Doktorları is seeking support for its "See the Good" campaign, launched for millions of cataract patients who cannot receive treatment due to financial and medical shortages. Board of Directors Chairman Prof. Dr. Ahmet Salduz stated: "Cataracts darken not just the eyes, but life itself. Every contribution to our 'See the Good' campaign will help someone see the world again and restore hope to a family."

December 16, 2025 | Yeryüzü Doktorları Health Center Brings Hope Again in Khan Yunis

Despite nearly 2 months since the ceasefire in Gaza, living conditions in the region continue to be extremely challenging. Yeryüzü Doktorları opened the doors of its new health center to the people of Gaza. Reopened with the participation of Gaza Ministry of Health officials and local residents, the health center is the third facility able to provide services in the area, alongside the Jordanian Hospital and the limited-capacity Nasser Hospital.

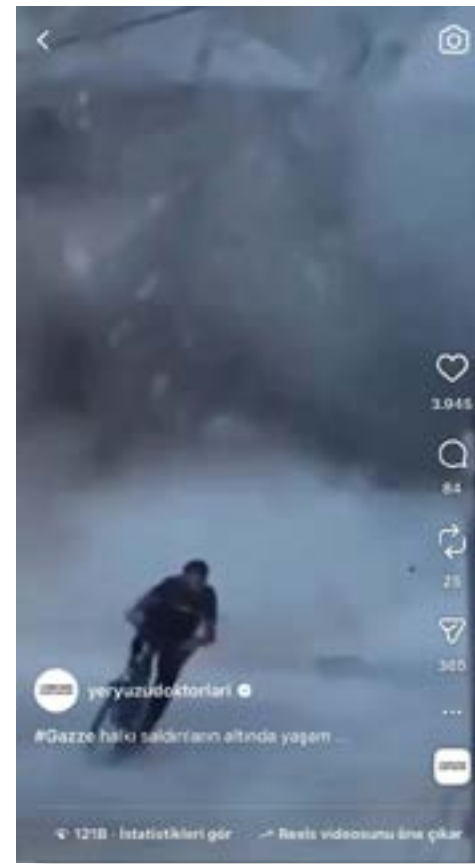

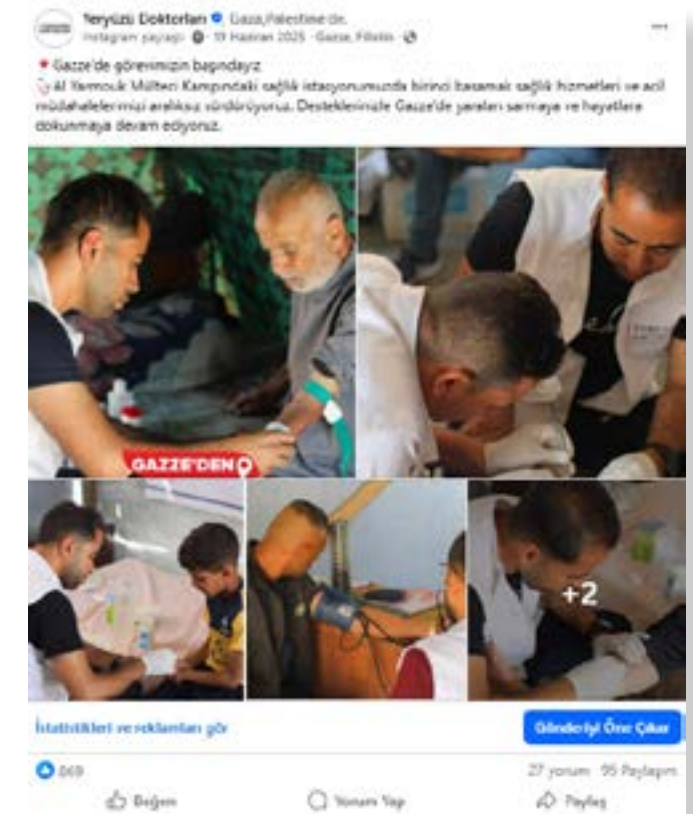

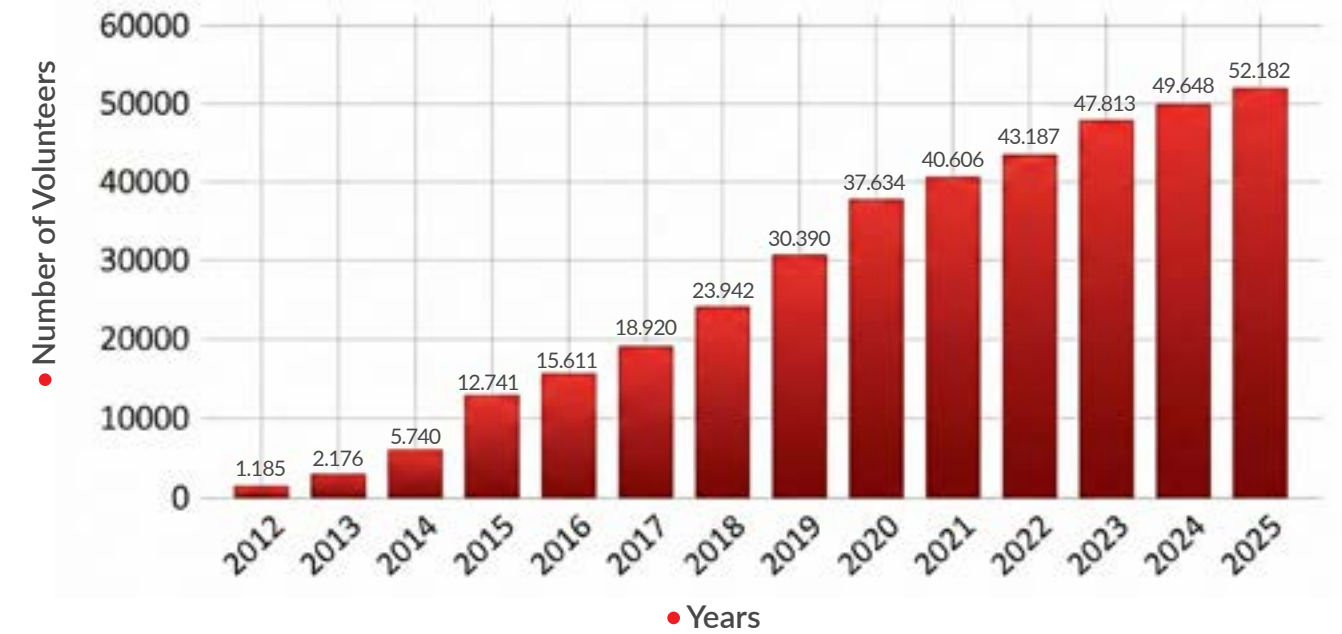

4.6. YOUNG DOCTORS WORLDWIDE

Young Doctors Worldwide (Young DWW) are the volunteers of Yeryüzü Doktorları who receive education in various departments of universities, including in particular the medical specialization areas. Young DWW organizes trainings, seminars, conferences, and volunteer-based projects to promote humanitarian action and social responsibility among university communities.

Throughout 2025, Young DWW organized 446 activities across 49 universities, including social events, conferences, symposiums, trainings, and flagship initiatives such as Health Street, Touch the Earth, Reaching Out to Children for Healing, and Voice of My Heart. These activities reached more than 12,000 beneficiaries.



Health Street

Young Doctors Worldwide conducts community awareness activities on topics such as diabetes, obesity, blood pressure, and rational drug use in village and city squares. In this context, 39 Health Street projects were carried out by 30 Young DW communities in 23 cities.



Touch the Earth

Young Doctors Worldwide, through its Touch the Earth project, aims to create positive impacts in the fields of health, education, and culture at schools in rural areas and lower-income districts. In this context, 43 Touch the Earth projects were carried out by 32 Young DW communities in 22 cities.

Young Doctors Worldwide organizes events with children undergoing hospital treatment, including various games and workshop activities. In this context, 34 Young DW communities held various events with more than 1,200 children in 24 cities.





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
